

# ACT Test Prep Opportunities 2019-2020



Throughout the year, students have multiple opportunities to take free practice ACT exams. Here are some resources to get you started.

## **ACT Testing at Each High School:**

A practice ACT test is scheduled for sophomores and juniors on October 30. Each building will be giving the practice test during the school day. Registration is not required. Results will be returned in Advisory.

An official free ACT test will be offered in the Spring to all Juniors. Registration is required and students will register for this test at school during Advisory.



## **Anoka County Library:** (Library card required for access)

Go to the Anoka County Library webpage and select the *Learning Express* from the Research/Online Databases menu. Use the practice materials found in the College Prep Center. Includes ACT, SAT, and AP test prep options.



## **March2Success:**

The US Army has teamed with Petersons and College Options Foundation, to offer practice tests, flashcards and games to help students prepare for college entrance exams. They offer 7 full length practice tests for both the SAT and ACT. Each section of the practice test is timed and scored just like the real test. When a section is completed, students can review their test and see detailed explanations of each problem. Ask for more information in the Career Center.


