Overview

Grades

Criminal Justice classes will consist of lectures, discussion, group projects, individual research, readings, videotapes, document work, quizzes, exams, and guest presentations. Points are rewarded accordingly.

Makeup work from absences will be two day for each day missed in class. The only exception to this rule will be if the absence is within the last two days of a grading period. Test scores my be raised if students find guest speakers that are willing to present about their role in the criminal justice system. If the speaker is excellent the lowest test score may be raised to 90 percent. If the speaker is excellent the lowest test score will be raised to 80 percent and finally, if the speaker is poor their lowest test score will be raised to 70 percent.

Extra Credit

Participation and current events can be found by students and presented at the beginning of the class period for extra credit. Students must find and bring in evidence from the newspaper or Internet. All articles must pertain to U.S. law or rulings.
