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Overview

The purpose of this course is to introduce the area of geography that focuses on the relationship between humans and the environment we live in. A common theme of today's world is the growing tension between globalization and the local diversity. Throughout the trimester we will examine these relationships through the various perspectives of geographic inquiry and spatial analysis.

Objectives include:

- 1. Students will understand cultural expressions influence interactions among peoples.
- 2. Students will acquire a comprehensive understanding the five themes of geography and their interrelated influence on history.
- 3. Students will understand that people organize to produce, distribute, and consume goods and services.
- 4. Student will understand that science and technology have advanced societies and world civilizations.
- 5. Students will be able to explain the rights, responsibilities and role of a citizen.
