Participation in commencement is voluntary – those not wishing to comply with the expectations and standards are asked to not participate.

Senior Recognition Ceremony Tuesday, May 28th at 8:44 a.m.

A list of all students graduating with Honor, High Honor and Highest Honors have been posted outside the Counseling Office. Invitations have been mailed home for the Senior Recognition Ceremony. The ceremony will be held on Tuesday, May 28, 2019 at 8:44 a.m. in the CRHS Auditorium. CRHS Honors, academic and athletic achievement awards will be presented at this ceremony. Students invited to the ceremony will be excused from class to line up in the auditorium foyer.

Honors Graduation Requirements

A list of all seniors graduating with honor, high honor, and highest honor is posted outside of the Guidance Office. Please check the list of honor grads for accuracy. If you have questions regarding your honor grad status, see <u>Mrs. Storrick</u> immediately. The requirements for graduating with honor are listed below:

Highest Honors

3.9 Weighted Grade Point Average Students must take at least ten credits in honors courses from two or more departments during their high school career.

High Honors

3.6 Weighted Grade Point Average Students must take at least six credits in honors courses during their high school career.

Honors

3.3 Weighted Grade Point Average There are no requirements concerning honors courses for this category.

Honors graduation status is determined by the cumulative, weighted GPA at the end of Trimester 2 of the senior year. PSEO students' status is determined after the fall semester. Students taking honors courses will receive honors recognition and a weighted grade if they earn a "C" or higher in the course. Rounding does not occur.

Financial Obligations Caps and Gowns Tuesday, May 28 2:30—3:30 p.m. Field House—West End

You will receive your cap and gown only after all fines and fees have been resolved. The graduation fee this year is \$10.00. Ms. Romano, our financial secretary, is collecting the money in the Finance Office. Please take care of this as soon as possible.

It is your responsibility to check to see if you have any fines. If you have not paid or cannot pay the fine on May 28th or your fine has not been resolved, do not come to the fieldhouse to pick up your cap and gown.

Seniors who do not, or cannot, pick up their caps and gowns on May 28, will need to see Mrs. Berkeland in the Counseling Office. They will be available before and during school only, not after school.

Baccalaureate

Please join us for Baccalaureate on Tuesday, May 28 at 7:00 p.m. in the Auditorium. Baccalaureate is a non-denominational worship service honoring all seniors. The BBQ will take place in the Cardinal Stadium and is free of charge for all seniors. This is an optional event. Behavior Before Graduation

Seniors are expected to show exemplary behavior through the last week and days of the school year and on graduation day. All school rules apply right through graduation day. Seniors need to be aware that poor behavior choices could result in suspension from school, which may mean they will not participate in the graduation ceremony. This would be very unfortunate. Students are encouraged to help one another make wise choices, especially during the last days of school.


Graduation Participation <u>Any senior who is more than one credit short at</u> <u>the time of graduation will not be allowed to</u> <u>participate in the graduation ceremony.</u>

Students who will not be participating in the graduation ceremony because they are more than one credit short should see their counselors to make plans to complete their requirements. The last day for students to complete credits through Regional Night School and other credit recovery programs is Wednesday, May 22.

Seating Information

Doors will open at 12:00 p.m. for general admission. Seating will be in Sections 1-7 and 19–24. Wheelchair seating is available at the top of Sections 2, 3 and 24. Seating will be on first come first serve basis. There will be no ticket required to enter. Everyone is welcome to attend.

Helium Balloons

3M Arena at Mariucci does not allow any helium filled balloons. Please do not bring any to the commencement ceremony as they will not be allowed in the building.

Graduation Line-up Time Seniors Arrive at 12:00 p.m.

Preparation and line-up time will be at 12:00 p.m. at 3M Arena at Mariucci. Please meet in the designated area. Please be in appropriate attire according to the graduation guidelines. Before the processional begins, students will be checked for proper attire and chemical use.

Behavior Standard for Graduation

Behavior is expected to be consistent with a dignified ceremony. We will not allow graduates to carry in beverages, beach balls, bubbles, airplanes, noise makers or any such distractions. We will not allow any performances from stage such as taking 'selfies,' gestures, yelling or symbols. Dignified behavior at this important occasion, in keeping with the spirit of the ceremony, is expected. Expressions of celebration should be reserved until the ceremony is concluded.

Appropriate Dress at Graduation

All caps and gowns will be the same color. Only school approved honor sashes will be allowed on the outside of the gown. Students that have met the requirements for the Center for Biomedical Sciences and Engineering, will also be wearing a medal representing completion of the program. You are **not allowed** to wear sunglasses or decorate/'bedazzle' your mortarboard cap for the ceremony. Appropriate attire including collared shirts, dress pants, skirts, dresses and dress shoes is strongly encouraged. We caution you in wearing high-heeled shoes; you will be walking longer distances at 3M Arena at Mariucci which includes going up and down arena stairs and ramps. Please avoid possible foot, ankle, and leg injuries and fatigue by choosing comfortable footwear.





Diploma Information

After graduation, you will pick up your Coon Rapids High School diploma in a designated area at 3M Arena at Mariucci. If you do not attend the ceremony and have completed diploma requirements, please pick up your diploma in the counseling office. **Diplomas will not be mailed.** Please call the Counseling Office before coming to pick up your diploma. The phone number is 763-506-7320.

You will not receive your diploma on graduation night if:

- You are a PSEO student and we have not received your final transcript.
- You are a special education student and will be attending Pathways or Bridges transitional programs.
- You have athletic equipment still checked out.
- You have an unresolved fee or fine.
- You have up to 1 credit to complete at summer school. Please see your counselor to make sure you are registered for the correct summer school classes.

Requesting Final Transcripts

Colleges and the NCAA require a final transcript to verify you have earned a diploma. Final transcripts are <u>not</u> automatically sent from the Counseling Office.

As part of cap & gown checkout, you will be able to request your final transcript . There is no charge for a final transcript if you have already sent an initial one via Naviance during the 2018-2019 school year. If you have not previously sent an initial transcript, there is a \$3 processing fee. See Mrs. Tryba in the Counseling office with questions.



On June 2nd, your senior son or daughter will be joining the other members of his or her graduating class in our graduation exercise. This is a very exciting time for our young people as they review their years here at Coon Rapids High School and look ahead to the future.

It's an exciting time for parents, also. We have watched your child grow over the years, both physically and emotionally. They have successfully navigated the past four years and the big day is near. The celebration plans are underway.

If you are hosting a party to celebrate the accomplishments of your graduate, **carefully consider your decision about serving alcoholic beverages to your guests.** Please remember that selling, furnishing, serving alcoholic beverages to minors is a violation on Minnesota law. It is a *gross misdemeanor offense*, which can result in up to one year in jail and up to a \$3,000 fine. In addition, a host who knowingly provides alcoholic beverages to a minor can be exposed to personal liability for injuries that result from that minor's intoxication. This liability also extends to hosts who knowingly allow minors to consume alcoholic beverages at the hosted party location.

The combination of drinking and driving is one of the leading killers of young people (ages 15 to 24) in Minnesota. Last year, 25% of all alcohol related fatal crashes involved drivers under the age of 21.

This is one of the happiest times for our graduates. Teach them to celebrate appropriately by setting good examples and making good decisions. Please make sure your graduation parties for minors are safe, responsible, and alcohol free.




Cans for Scholarships



If you are having an open house,


