WHAT IS TITLE I?

PARTNERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Title I is a federally funded program that is part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The goal of this law is to help all students meet grade level expectations in reading and math as written in the Minnesota state standards. Our school has extra reading and math intervention teachers who can help the students who are performing below grade level in reading and/or math. This is done to be fair and equitable for all students.

The elementary schools which have over 40% of their students who get free and reduced priced meals receive Title I dollars to help all the students in the school. We are a Title I Schoolwide school, and so we write goals each year to meet the needs of our school. These goals are written with staff, family, and student voices. The resources and money that come from Title I are used to meet those goals and support student success.

Minnesota's English Language Arts (ELA) academic standards are taught in all classrooms (Kindergarten through 5th grade). Anoka-Hennepin uses McGraw Hill's Reading Wonders curriculum for reading, writing, speaking, and listening instruction. When a student receives additional services, the same themes, vocabulary, skills, and strategies are taught. Students are challenged to read every day and write about complex texts. Also, students collaborate through conversations about literacy.

Minnesota's Math academic standards are taught in all classrooms (Kindergarten through 5th grade). We use Bridges in Mathematics and the connected intervention program called Bridges Intervention. It addresses all the Minnesota math standards in a fun, engaging, and accessible way for all students. The program includes:

- Hands on activities for exploring, developing, testing, discussing, and applying math concepts.
- Presentations of math concepts with language, pictures, and movement to meet the needs of all students.
- Opportunities for students to solve math problems in many ways which helps students to build more flexible and efficient problem solving strategies.

2022-2023 SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT STRATEGIES

- Increase academic achievement in reading and math
- Implementation of Character Strong social emotional curriculum
- Increase student engagement and reduce the academic achievement gap through equitable measures Progress on these school efforts will be reported to families at PTCO meetings once a trimester.

Anoka-Hennepin's elementary school program is based on the belief that all children are valuable and unique individuals, and that children learn best when the home, school and community work together. Wilson Elementary teachers and support staff will deliver strong Tier I and Tier II instruction and monitor student progress to move all students towards meeting state standards.
