CREATIVE CURRICULUM FOCUS

Physical Development:
Demonstrates fine-motor strength and coordination

Uses writing and drawing tools

The art curriculum in the preschool classroom provides children with opportunities to:

- Use a variety of drawing tools- crayons, markers, paint brushes, and pencils
- Tear paper
- Cut paper using scissors
- Develop eye-hand coordination as they create works of art
- Squeeze glue bottles
- Finger-paint

Children also develop fine-motor strength when squeezing and rolling play-dough. Stacking blocks or legos allows children to practice their fine-motor skills and develop coordination.

THINGS TO DO AT HOME

- Provide a variety of writing tools-markers, crayons, pencils
- Have child-safe scissors available
- Provide blank paper for writing and drawing
- Let your child tear or scrunch-up paper
- Have your child help you make lists-let them write words on the grocery list (apple, milk, bread)
- Give your child a paintbrush and a bucket of water-let them paint the driveway
- Use sidewalk chalk for outside drawing
