Buildings & Grounds - Maintenance Specialists - Districtwide

Essential Functions:

- Install, repair and maintain all phases of electrical, pneumatic, mechanical, boilers, burners, E.M.S. equipment, fire alarm, security systems, refrigeration and food service equipment.
- Other duties as directed by supervisor.

Minimum Qualifications:

- High School Diploma or equivalent.
- <u>Must possess one or more of the appropriate license of the position description</u>; thorough knowledge and <u>at least five years experience in at least one or more of the related</u> maintenance fields.
- Operational knowledge of electrical and mechanical equipment such as boilers, heating and ventilation controls and motors, air conditioning, pneumatic and E.M.S., fire alarm, security, and DDC equipment.
- Must be capable of repairing clocks, scoreboards, E.M.S. equipment, mimeographs.
- Strong mechanical aptitude and abilities.
- Ability/desire to work when and where requested by Supervisor of Maintenance.
- Ability to maintain regular attendance, which includes completing an assigned day.
- Ability to perform position responsibilities including physical factors, work devices and materials handling, data functions, and people functions.
- Must be physically working in the building/on site.

Maintenance Specialist positions for whom the District requires licensure will receive the following stipend*:

- Electricians License \$4:30 / hour
- Refrigeration/Universal License \$2.15 / hour
- Master Gas License \$4.30 / hour
- Reduced Pressure Zone State Certification \$2.15 / hour
- DDC HVAC \$4.30 / hour
- Low Voltage Power LTD Tech \$2.15 / hour

There shall be no stacking of licenses; in addition the parties may mutually agree to add addition licenses as may be necessary. *It is understood that these stipends are not included in the March 1, 1999, though February 28, 2002, total package settlement costs.

Physical Factors includes:

<u>Constant</u>: walking, pushing, stooping, squatting, repetitive arm, simple grasp, hearing, visual accommodation:

<u>Frequent</u>: lifting waist to chest, lifting below waist, pulling, kneeling, twisting, reaching, tasting/smelling, near vision, midrange vision, depth perception, field of vision;

(Physical Factors includes continued):

Occasional: standing, sitting, reclining, lifting above shoulders, carrying, climbing, balancing, crouching, repetitive foot, firm grasp, fingering, feeling, talking far vision.

Must be able to lift a minimum of 125 pounds.

Occasional to Frequent: lifting, pulling, pushing and carrying materials weighing up to 125 pounds.

Frequent to Constant: lifting, pulling, pushing and carrying materials weighing up to 40 pounds.
