




Title I







The Minnesota Academic Standards in Mathematics are organized by grade level into four content strands: 1) Number and Operation, 2) Algebra, 3) Geometry and Measurement, and 4) Diak Analysis and Probability, Each strand has one or more standards, and the benchmarks fo exchandard are designated by a code. In reading the coding, please note that for \$1.3.1.2 this risk ard feet to the hird grade, the 1 refers to the Number and Operation strand, the next 3 refers to the third standard for that strand, and the 2 refers to the second benchmark for that standards.
