school?

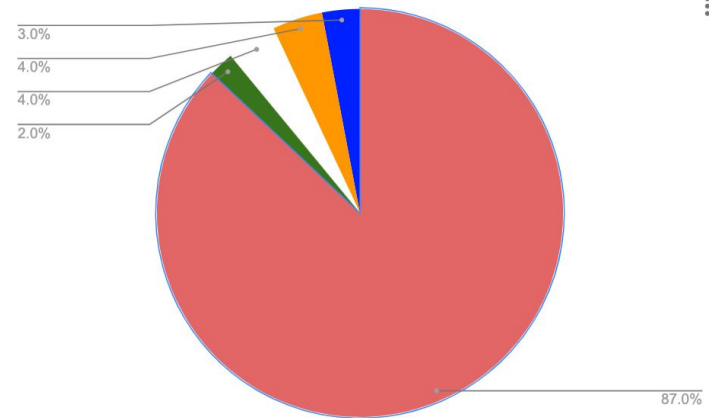
Title I

Title I is a federally funded program through the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).

The purpose of these funds is to give all children in our school a fair, equitable, and significant opportunity to meet grade level expectations as written in the MN State Standards.

How are Title I funds used in our district?

- 87%** - Intervention Teachers
- 2%** - Family Engagement
- 4%** - Schoolwide School Improvement Efforts
- 4%** - District Homeless Services
- 3%** - Administrative Costs
