The mission of Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) is to strengthen families and enhance the ability of all parents and caregivers to provide the best possible environment for the healthy growth and development of children.

Our goal is to provide affordable, quality programming. Fees can be waived or reduced if family circumstances would make payment a hardship.

HANDBOOK HIGHLIGHTS

- Weather-Related Closures When snow or cold weather limits the ability to provide student transportation and staff travel to and from school, Anoka-Hennepin Schools may close.
- Arrival Please try to arrive no earlier than five minutes before class time. Sign in, hang up coats, wash hands, put on name tags.
- Clothing Dress for getting messy, exploring and having fun.
- Cell Phones ECFE is a cell phone free zone. Please turn your phone to silent and put it away.
- Illness Policy Parents/caregivers and children should stay home when sick so as not to spread the illness to other families. This includes staying home if there has been a fever, diarrhea, or vomiting in the past 24 hours.
- Immunization Record Minnesota law requires that families provide an immunization record for every child enrolled in ECFE classes or file a legal medical or conscientious exemption.
- Safety Drills Fire drills, tornado drills, and lockdown drills are practiced throughout the year. Parents/caregivers are expected to participate.
- Toileting Parents/caregivers are responsible for changing their own child's diaper or taking them to the bathroom. Please bring your own changing supplies.

CLASSROOM INFORMATION

ARRIVAL

- Because staff are preparing the classroom, please try to arrive no earlier than five minutes before class time.
- ECFE is a cell phone free zone. Please turn your phone off and put it away.
- Hang coats and personal belongings in designated area.
- Sign in, put a nametag on yourself and your child every week.
- Wash hands with soap and water before starting class activities.

BIRTHDAYS/HOLIDAYS

- Time spent in ECFE classes is limited and is focused on learning through play rather than celebrations.
- The traditions and cultural backgrounds of each child and family are valued and respected. We understand that holidays are an important part of a family's traditions and are celebrated uniquely in each family.

CLOTHING

- Dress for getting messy, exploring and having fun.
- In the winter, be sure to bring shoes if either you or your child wears boots.

DISCIPLINE

- Anoka-Hennepin Schools Early Learning programs use teaching strategies and positive behavior management techniques to help children learn developmentally-appropriate behaviors for interacting with other children in a school environment. If children need additional support, parents will be contacted and expected to work with teaching staff to develop and implement a guidance plan to ensure a safe and secure classroom for all children and staff.
- As mandated reporters, we are required by law to report any signs of child abuse.

ROOM GUIDELINES

- Follow your child's lead. Use eye contact and get down to your child's level.
- Focus on your relationship. Communicate through touching, smiling and encouragement.
- Stay with your child you are in charge of their safety and behavior.
- Encourage your child to participate.
- Young children are not expected to share. Sharing is a learned behavior that will develop over time.
- We expect crying, fighting and other very normal behavior from children. It's okay; this is a time for learning!

CLASS STRUCTURE

- You and your child will spend time together in the classroom, which is set up with learning activities for families to enjoy together.
- During discussion time, children and parents/caregivers generally separate from each other (infants four months and younger stay with their parent/caregiver the entire class time).
- In some younger-age classes, separation is gradual. Staff will work with you to make the process of separating during these classes go smoothly for both you and your child.

CIRCLE TIME

- Some children will get up and wander; that is okay. We ask that the parent/caregiver stay in the circle while staff guide children back. Children ages three to five are encouraged to stay in circle.
- Children learn by repetition, so we often repeat songs and fingerplays.

CHILDREN'S TIME

- Children stay with the early childhood staff in the classroom.
- The teacher's role during children's time is to observe, encourage and guide children's exploration and give help when needed.
- Children learn through their play. It is their work. They learn about themselves and others through initiating and participating in activities they choose and by being with other children.
- During this time, children are learning to:
 - Develop their senses.
 - Be in charge of themselves.
 - Figure out how things work and solve problems.
 - Develop and express imagination and creativity.
 - Express their feelings and energy in healthy ways.
 - Talk and share ideas.
 - Build strength and control of their bodies.
 - Increase their ability to concentrate.
- A simple snack may be shared. Snack time provides a great opportunity for children to work on social, emotional and language skills. Donations of snacks are appreciated.

PARENT/CAREGIVER DISCUSSION TIME

- Discussion time is planned to be relevant and tailored to participant needs, children's ages, and parent educator expertise.
 The Parent Education Core Curriculum Framework is used as a topic guide and content is structured around five main areas:
 - Early childhood development
 - Family development
 - Culture and community
 - Parent development
 - Parent-child relationship
- The parent educator brings knowledge and information based on current research and past experience with families.
- During discussion, keep in mind:
 - Personal information shared in the group is confidential.
 - Bring your questions, resources and other information to share.
 - We all have different ways of parenting. It's okay to disagree and still support each other.
- Parents/caregivers return to classroom following discussion time.

TSG FEEDBACK

- As part of the ECFE class, you and the early childhood staff will have opportunities to observe and learn about how your child is growing, developing, playing, and learning.
- While observing children in the classroom, ECFE teachers use an adapted version of a child's development and learning assessment called Teaching Strategies Gold.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

CLEANING TOYS

- We disinfect tables, toys and equipment after each class.
- If you notice your child mouthing a toy, please put it in the designated bin when they are done playing with it so it can be sanitized.

ILLNESS

- Parents/caregivers and children should stay home when sick so as not to spread the illness to other families. This includes staying home if there has been a fever, diarrhea, or vomiting in the past 24 hours.
- In order to provide a healthy environment for everyone, you will be asked to leave if a child appears ill.
- Notify the early childhood staff if your child has a communicable disease (such as Coronavirus/COVID-19, whooping cough, measles, mumps, chicken pox, strep throat, hand, foot and mouth disease, etc.) and has exposed other children. Staff will notify the parents/caregivers of the children who were exposed.

IMMUNIZATION RECORD

- Minnesota law requires that families provide an immunization record for every child enrolled in ECFE classes or file a legal medical or conscientious exemption.
- A link to download the immunization form is sent with every ECFE class registration confirmation.

SAFETY DRILLS

- As part of our ongoing commitment to student safety, fire, tornado, and lockdown drills are practiced throughout the year.
- When safety drills are conducted, parents/caregivers are expected to participate. If you are in a building during a drill, follow the instructions of early childhood or building staff.

TOILETING

- Parents/caregivers are responsible for changing their child's diaper or for taking them to the bathroom. A good time to do this is before leaving for discussion time.
- Please bring your own changing supplies. There is spray disinfectant to wash the changing table before and after using it. Please use the safety strap while changing your child's diaper.
- Wash your hands and your child's hands before returning to the classroom.
