Attendance

Regular attendance is very important for a child's learning and preparation for kindergarten.

If a child must be absent, call the classroom and bus company (if applicable) to make them aware of the absence.

- If a child misses two class days in a row with no phone call from a parent/caregiver, the instructor will call the child's home.
- If a child misses another two class days in a row with no phone call, the child may be dropped from the preschool program.
- If a child misses a total of one school week (5 school days) with no phone call, the child will be dropped from the preschool program.

Birthdays/Holidays

We help children celebrate their special day with a crown/tiara, birthday song, and/or certificate from the instructors. If your family does not celebrate birthdays, please let staff know.

Time spent in preschool is valuable learning time for children and does not allow for holiday parties.

Cell phone policy

Anoka-Hennepin Schools Preschool is a cell phone free zone. Please turn your phone off while dropping off and picking up your child.

Class withdrawal

If you need to withdraw your child from class, please call the main preschool office at 763-506-1500. If there is tuition paid when a withdrawal occurs after the start of a month, there is no refund for that current month; any prepaid tuition will be refunded.



Weather-related school closings

When snow or cold weather limits the ability to provide student transportation and staff travel to and from school, Anoka-Hennepin Schools may close.

Where can you find updates on school closings?













Preschool classes are not made up nor is a credit issued for cancellations due to emergency or weather-related closings.

Guidance and positive discipline

Preschool staff uses positive behavior guidance to help children learn how to interact with others and use the classroom materials. Children are taught acceptable options for challenging behavior.

If contacted regarding your child's behavior in school, you will be expected to work with school staff on a positive intervention behavior plan to ensure a safe and secure classroom for all children and staff.

Toileting

Children who are not on an IEP must be toilet trained to attend preschool. Teachers can provide verbal guidance if necessary. This means a child knows when they need to use the bathroom and can independently take care of their own personal needs. Pull-up diapers are not a substitute for being toilet trained. If a child is experiencing toileting accidents in school, the parent or a caregiver may be asked to postpone attendance in preschool until the child is completely toilet trained.



Tuition payments, if applicable

It is important that tuition is paid on time. Non-payment of tuition may result in the child being dropped from preschool. If you are having difficulty making payments, contact the main preschool office at 763-506-1500 to make arrangements.

Weapons

It is the policy of the Anoka-Hennepin School District to maintain a positive, safe and secure learning and working environment. No weapons or items that look like weapons (toy guns, knives, etc.) are allowed at school, on the school bus or on school property. If a child brings one to school, the parent will be called and the child may be dropped from the preschool program.

Early Childhood Screening

Early Childhood Screening is required for children enrolled in Anoka-Hennepin Schools Preschool within 90 days of starting preschool. If your child has not yet been screened, please schedule a screening appointment online -

Failure to complete screening could result in your child being withdrawn from the preschool program. Children are screened based on age at the time of screening. Appointments typically take an hour.

Keep your family information up-to-date.

Notify the classroom instructor and main preschool office if there are any changes to your address, phone numbers, email addresses, health information, or persons authorized to pick up your child during the school year.

Allergies

If your child has allergies (including food allergies) contact your child's instructor. You will be asked to complete an *Allergy Alert Plan*.

Illness

If your child is ill, call the classroom and bus company (if applicable) each day to make them aware of the absence.

When should my child stay home?

- If there is a temperature of 100 degrees or more. Temperature must be normal (98.6 degrees) for 24 hours without feverreducing medication before returning.
- Vomiting, diarrhea, any undiagnosed rash, discharge from eye, ears or heavy nasal discharge, severe cold symptoms.

Exposure to communicable diseases (such as Coronavirus/COVID-19, scabies, whooping cough, measles, ringworm, fifth disease, mumps, chicken pox, impetigo, diphtheria, scarlet fever, strep throat, hand, foot and mouth disease) should be reported to classroom teacher. If your child is contagious they may not attend preschool until 24-hours after medication begins or released by doctor. For strep throat, child may return to preschool 12-hours after medication has been started.

If your child becomes ill at school, a parent or authorized person will be called to take your child home.

Accident notification

If there is an accident or injury, staff will take the necessary care for the child including:

- Administering necessary first-aid.
- Contacting parent/caregiver of accident and first-aid applied. If appropriate, the parent/caregiver may be asked to pick the child up.

If immediate emergency treatment is needed, staff will contact 911 immediately. A parent or caregiver will be contacted directly after 911 call.

Safety drills

Fire, tornado, and lockdown drills are practiced throughout the school year. Staff plan carefully to make drill practices a positive experience for the children. Talk with your child's instructor if you have any questions about safety drills in preschool.

Clothing

Children should wear comfortable, washable play clothes and shoes. Paint shirts are provided and worn for messy activities. Please label personal items:

- backpacks
- hats
- jackets
- snowpants
- mittens
- boots



The preschool program is funded by Minnesota state funding as well as participant paid tuition. The state funding requires parent/caregiver participation in preschool program activities.

Assessments

Each child's progress in preschool is observed and monitored throughout the year. Classroom instructors look for growth in the developmental areas of social/emotional, literacy, math, physical, cognitive, and language development.

Conferences

Conferences are held twice a year, in the fall and the spring. This is a time to talk with the teacher and plan learning goals for your child. You will also receive important information about their development and progress.

Home Learning Activities

To reinforce and build on preschool skills, home learning activities are offered in all classes. These are fun, entertaining activities or a game. Parents/caregivers are encouraged to work together on the activities.

Pre-K to Grade 3 Programs

Anoka-Hennepin Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) offers a number of parent education opportunities for families with children from preschool age through grade three. These opportunities offer a community of support and resources. View the current class offerings online:

Communications

Teachers will primarily be using email as a way to keep parents/caregivers informed and engaged with their child's learning. Be sure to check often for learning activities or important announcements.

Parent Advisory Council

The ECFE/Preschool Parent Advisory Council (PAC) is a volunteer group of parents/caregivers who provide input and support to the Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) and Preschool programs.

The Advisory Council sponsors a number of events including:

- Annual Vehicle Day event,
- Community Baby Shower for families in need.
- staff appreciation events, and
- a mini-grant program for classroom teachers to purchase needed enriching classroom materials.

Meetings are held the second Monday of each month during the school year from 6:30 to 8 p.m. Child care is provided with advance notice. All are welcome.
