All schools in the Anoka-Hennepin School District will conduct the parent attitude and satisfaction survey through June 16. In addition, a random sample of parents/guardians of some elementary students will be surveyed by telephone. The telephone survey is brief, less than five minutes. All responses will be confidential.

District to hold facilities election in November

Following the recommendations from the *Fit for the Future Task Force*, the Anoka-Hennepin School Board is moving forward to ask voters for funding to address facility issues this election season.

The funding generated from bond and operating levies will create appropriately sized facilities, remove portable classrooms to increase safety, and provide flexibility for today's classroom needs. That would mean: building two new elementary schools — one in Blaine and another in Ramsey; putting additions on the district's five traditional high schools (Andover, Anoka, Blaine, Champlin Park and Coon Rapids high schools); and providing general upgrades on existing elementary and middle schools — focusing on science classrooms and library media centers.

2017-2018 Madison Recommended School Supply List

Please label supplies with your child's name unless otherwise indicated.

Grade K:

Please <u>label</u> the following supplies:

- 1 Large school bag or backpack
- 1 wide-lined spiral notebook
- 3 folders with deep pockets sturdy/plastic
- 1 1-inch, 3 ring binder and 20 page protectors
- 1 paint shirt (can be a recycled, bigger t-shirt)

Please <u>DO NOT</u> label the following items:

- 2 4 oz glue bottles
- 6 or more glue sticks
- 2 boxes of 16 Crayola color crayons
- 1 box of Crayola markers
- 2 pkgs. colored pencils
- 2 pink rectangular erasers
- 1 box Kleenex

Grade 1: REPLACE AS NEEDED

- 48 pencils #2 lead, Ticonderoga brand is preferred
- Crayons (box of 24)
- Erasers (2 pink rectangular)
- 3 folders with pockets
- School box (5" x 8 ½" recommended size)
- Large box of tissue to share
- Ruler (inch and centimeter)
- Backpack or school bag no wheels please
- Markers (washable, non-toxic, low-odor) 1 set of thin markers, 1 set of wide markers
- Paint shirt
- Scissors (Fiskars type)
- 2 8 oz. bottles of Elmer's School Glue
- Colored pencils (prefer Twistables)
- Watercolor paints (prefer Prang, Crayola or Artista)
- 4 or 5 glue sticks
- 4 dry erase markers black, low-odor
- Headphones for the computer lab can order from Madison in the fall
- Calculator (Texas Instrument TI 108 recommended) can order from Madison in the fall

Grade 4: REPLACE AS NEEDED

- 1 wide-lined, 3-subject spiral notebook
- 2 composition notebooks
- 3 folders with pockets, **NO 3-ring binders**
- 1 highlighter
- 3 dry-erase markers wide, black low odor
- Small zippered pencil pouch
- Large box of facial tissue to share
- Headphones for the computer lab can order from Madison in the fall
- Extra donations for the classrooms:
 - Ticonderoga pencils
 - 3-M Post-It Tabs, 2 inch

Due to limited storage space in classrooms and lockers, any materials not listed above need to be stored at home.

Grade 5:

- 1 white 3-ring binder, 1" with clear plastic on cover
- 1 3-ring, flat pencil pouch
- NO TRAPPER KEEPERS
- 1 Accordion folder (7 pocket) for take home papers and homework
