OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

Written Work must be turned in. All written work assigned must be turned in.

Learning Targets - Music Exploration

- 1. Students will understand basic musical notation and reading.
- 2. Students will demonstrate basic techniques for playing various instruments.
- 3. Students will critique and analyze music.
- 4. Students will understand and place greater value on various musical cultures and its peoples.
- 5. Students will understand and identify musical instruments by sight & sound.
- 6. Students will understand how music reflects similar cultural themes and patterns found in Art, Dance, Literature, Social Patterns, etc., of various cultures.
- 7. Students will explore music through the use of technology.
- 8. Students will understand music history and how it has evolved as it relates to the creation and performance of music.
- 9. Students will improvise musical patterns which are complimentary to those played by others. (i.e. Call & Response, Q & A).
- 10. Students will demonstrate techniques of musical composition through various mediums.
- 11. Students will create a meaningful connection to the social arts and maintain an active connection to music throughout one's lifetime.
