- 4. Be an active participant, mentally as well as physically, in each rehearsal and performance.
- 5. Maintain a cooperative, collaborative attitude during all rehearsals.
- 6. Mark parts in pencil according to the instructions of the director.
- 7. Keep equipment in playable condition, which includes having usable reeds, mouthpieces, etc., as well has having all necessary mutes, valve oil, pencils, etc.
- 8. Contribute to a fun, yet energetic working atmosphere.

## **OBLIGATIONS OF THE DIRECTORS**

- 1. Be present on time for rehearsals, prepared and ready to go.
- 2. Develop and communicate a solid interpretation of each composition being rehearsed.
- 3. To bring to each rehearsal a positive, collaborative frame of mind.
- 4. Formulate effective rehearsal strategies to implement interpretation.
- 5. To maintain accurate attendance records and complete all aspects of student evaluation in a fair, consistent, and open manner.
- 6. Maintain a collaborative, energetic, and enjoyable working atmosphere.

#### REQUIREMENTS

All students will participate in all performances, class activities and home practice.

#### OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

Written Work must be turned in. All written work assigned must be turned in.

## **Essential Learning Outcomes - Music Level I**

#### Music Performance

- 1. I can sight read on my instrument in the keys of B flat, E flat and F concert pitch with diatonic patterns with rhythms including eighth notes.
- 2. I can demonstrate efficient posture and breathing to produce a characteristic tone for my instrument.
- 3. I can demonstrate rhythmic accuracy with steady tempo as required by classroom repertoire.
- 4. I can demonstrate pitch accuracy as required by classroom repertoire.
- 5. I can perform with appropriate articulation/stickings as required by classroom repertoire.
- 6. I can perform with characteristics of expression including dynamics, expression, phrasing and nuance as required by classroom repertoire.
- 7. I can play a chromatic scale ascending and descending.
- 8. I can play all major scales one octave ascending and descending.
- 9. I understand and can demonstrate appropriate concert etiquette as a performer and listener.

#### Music Theory

- 1. I can read and explain music using the standard notation system such as rhythm, pitch, keys, meter and intervals.
- 2. I can identify foreign language terms found in literature regarding tempo, expression, and interpretation.

#### Music Composition
