Contract

Below is an excerpt taken from the Minnesota State High School League Eligibility Bulletin. A complete copy of the bulletin is available from the activities secretary if you would like another copy.

VIOLATIONS OF TRAINING RULES

- A. Philosophy and Purpose: The Minnesota State High School League recognizes the use of mood-altering chemicals as a significant health problem for many adolescents, resulting in negative effects on behavior, learning and the total development of each individual. The misuse and abuse of mood-altering chemicals for some adolescents affect extra-curricular participation and development of related skills. Others are affected by the misuse and abuse of family, team members or other significant persons in their lives.
- B. Bylaw: Alcohol/Drugs; Tobacco; Vandalism of School Property; Violation of Criminal Code:
 - 1. A student shall not use, have in possession, buy, sell or give away a beverage containing alcohol (regardless of quantity) or participate in an unlawful event that involves the use of alcohol during the calendar year. Participate includes being at a party where alcohol is being consumed.
 - 2. A student shall not consume, have in possession, buy, sell or give away marijuana or any substance defined by law as a drug, unless specifically prescribed by her doctor for the student's own use, or participate in an unlawful event that involves the use of drugs during the calendar year.
 - 3. A student shall not use, have in possession, buy, sell or give away tobacco during the calendar year.
 - 4. Students involved in vandalism of school property or violation of the criminal code may be subject to the same disciplinary action specified for alcohol/drugs.

Note: All of the above bylaws apply to the 12 month calendar year.

C. Penalty:

Students who violate any of these rules shall be suspended from participation in all Anoka-Hennepin School District No. 11 activities for the time specified herein

1. First Violation: After confirmation of the first violation, the student shall lose eligibility for the next two (2) consecutive interscholastic events or two (2) weeks of a season in which the student is a participant, whichever is greater.
