Right- a freedom Responsibility- a duty

Executive branch- the part of government that enforces the laws

Legislative Branch- the part of government that makes the laws

Judicial branch- the part of government that decides what laws mean and whether laws obey the constitution.

Common good- whatever helps the most people in a community

Citizen- an official member of a community, state or country

Civic discourse- discussion or debate about government issues

Majority rule- in an election, the larger number of voters make the decision

Minority rights- laws that protect minority groups and guarantee equal rights for all.

Democracy- a government in which the people govern themselves

Election- the process by which citizens vote for people to represent them

Tax- a fee citizens and others pay to the government

Vote- to make an official choice

Perspective- a point of view
