

Anoka-Hennepin Schools is currently conducting a review of middle school programming, a process last undertaken when the district shifted from a semester-model to a trimester-model at the middle school level in 2009.

The overall goal: Middle school programming seeks to improve academic outcomes and create caring and challenging learning communities that meet the

needs of young adolescents and work toward the district's strategic priorities. The process will result in recommending changes to middle school programming with the following desired outcomes:


- Improve student achievement
- Improve student behavior
- Reduce costs while maintaining high-quality exploratory programming













I HEARD THIS IS GOING TO REMOVE ELECTIVES FOR STUDENTS?

Since students are provided similar programming in grades 6 and 7 there are no changes to the number of elective options for students in those grades. It is possible that students in eighth grade will be offered one less period of elective options. The current schedule offers up to six elective options over three class periods and that could be modified to four options over two class periods starting in 2025-26.

IS THIS REVIEWING BEING DONE TO CUT THE BUDGET?

The program review was scheduled in advance of the District's two-phase budget reducation and reallocation plan. The review is a best practice activity to review all curricular options to ensure the programming offered is relevant for both today's students and future learners. The option to modify the schedule offers the ability to maintain class sizes and increase academic time while also providing a partial solution for the district's overall budget.

WHEN ARE THE DECISIONS BEING MADE?

Following the collection of feedback from the community and staff, the School Board is expected to discuss options at the June 10, 2024 work session with action to be taken at a future date.

WHEN WOULD ANY CHANGES GO INTO EFFECT?

Any changes to the middle school program as a result of this review are scheduled for implementation in the fall of 2025. District staff would use the 2024-25 school year to prepare.

WHEN ARE OTHER BUDGET REDUCTION/REALIGNMENT DECISIONS BEING MADE?

The Phase 2 budget reduction and reallocation process will begin this fall with the school board expected to provide direction by December 2024.
