Materials

Bring paper and a pencil every day. A scientific calculator will be sufficient for much of this course, however, a graphing calculator will occasionally be necessary. If possible, please try to have access to a TI-83 or TI-84 series graphing calculator. I will have some graphing calculators for in-class use only if you are unable to find/purchase one.

Homework & Quizzes

Homework is a very important part of learning. Be sure to complete your homework every day and to ask questions about the material that you do not understand. Homework will typically be collected the day after it is assigned. Late homework will only be eligible for partial credit. If you miss a day, it is your responsibility to get all make up work. Notes and homework assignments will be posted online daily at moodle.anoka.k12.mn.us. Successful completion of homework is often a key component to having success on tests. Quizzes will occasionally be given as well. These will vary in point value but will have the important role of giving you an indication as to how well you know recently covered material and how ready you may be for upcoming tests.

Tests & Projects

Each chapter will culminate in a chapter test. Each chapter test will be typically worth 30 to 40 points depending upon the amount of material covered in the chapter. A large part of your grade is based upon test scores so it is important that you are prepared. There will also be at least one class project within the course. Project grades are treated like test scores and will be worth about 30 points. Avoid missing test days as it is often difficult to find time to make up tests. Students who take tests late typically score lower than if they take it on time.

Cell Phones

Cell phones should not be used in this class unless you are accessing the online solutions. Please be aware of the school policy regarding cell phone use during tests. The use of a cell phone/unauthorized electronic device during a period where an assessment is given (test, quiz, etc.) will be considered cheating regardless of the intention, resulting in a zero for the assessment and referral to the office for possible disciplinary action.

Additional Thoughts

Common sense should drive your actions at all times. For example, there are policies about hats, cell phones, tardies, etc... If you don't want an issue related to one of these items, follow the policy. My biggest concern about student behavior is in regards to those who are not considerate of the learning of others. Classes will be very large this year and I must be focused upon student learning instead of dealing with disruptions. Please don't use up my time or distract others with irresponsible or inconsiderate actions.
