Your Appearance

Men:

- Clean your nails and use some hand lotion.

 - Your socks, shoes and belt should be the same color
- When you sit down, unbutton the bottom button on your jacket.

Women:

- If you are wearing a skirt or dress, wear pantyhose.
- If you do your nails, French tips or soft colors look more professional
- More than two earrings per ear is distracting
- For hair, bigger is not better
- Keep necklines conservative; limit the lace and neon colors - think professional.
