

# Illness and Quarantine Guidelines

## PERSON A →

Any person who has tested for or having symptoms of COVID-19

**Notify Health Service**

**With symptoms:**

*Isolation until the following requirements are met:*

- 10 days since symptoms first appeared **AND**
- 24 hours with no fever with no fever reducing medication **AND** symptoms are improving.

**Without symptoms:**

*Isolation for 10 days from test date as long as no symptoms develop.*

Monitor self for symptoms twice per day.

**Definitions:**

**Isolation** separates infected people from those who are not sick.

**Quarantine** separates those who have been exposed to an infectious person.

**Close contact** is anyone who has been within 6' for more than 15 minutes while another was contagious.

## PERSON B →

Any person with close contact to Person A and living in the same household

**Notify Health Service**

**Quarantine for 14 days from last close contact**

Two weeks after Covid-19 vaccination series is complete and up to 90 days from last dose - no quarantine is required if the person has no Covid-19 symptoms.

## PERSON B2 →

Any person with close contact to positive not living in the same household

**Notify Health Service**

**No symptoms:**

**Quarantine immediately. 14 days is the safest option.**

1. Quarantine for 14 days after last close contact of less than 6' for more than 15 minutes at a time or if someone in your household has Covid-19.
2. Quarantine for 10 days
  - You do not have symptoms
  - You have not tested positive for Covid-19
  - No one in the household has tested positive for Covid-19
3. A shorten quarantine to 7 days to be considered when documentation is provided by your provider.
4. Two weeks after Covid-19 vaccination series is completed and up to 90 days from last dose no quarantine is required if the person has no COVID-19 symptoms.

## PERSON C

Any person without close contact to person A or any person with close contact to untested person A and not in the same household

**No quarantine required**

Continue normal daily monitoring for symptoms.

If Person B develops symptoms within 48 hours before contact with Person C, or tests positive, contact Health Service with questions.
