ELEMENTARY GROUPS

This year our elementary advisors are setting aside, but not forgetting, our Seven Teachings in order to inspire our youth through stories of Notable Native People!

So far this year students have reviewed the Seven Teachings and talked about:

- Ira Hayes, who raised the flag on Iwo Jima in WWII.
 - Students also wrote letters to veterans!
- Chief Joseph, who is known for leading his people over 1400 miles to escape reservation and war.

Students are just starting to learn about:

• John Harrington, the first Native American man in space.



SECONDARY GROUPS

This year our secondary advisors are focusing on Medicine Wheel Teachings. Advisors were able to meet with Elder Hope Flanagan to learn Anishinaabe medicine wheel teachings and various ways to use the wheel as a teaching tool with youth.

Students have been exploring seasonal activities and changes, directions, and how medicine wheel can be used as a tool to self-reflect on our mental, emotional, physical, and spiritual wellbeing and balance.
