

How do students join the program?

Students who identify as having Native American Heritage on their enrollment paperwork are automatically enrolled in the program. Families have the opportunity to opt-out if they wish.

Who is American Indian Education?

- 1 (one) Program Coordinator
- 2 (two) Elementary Advisors
- 5 (five) Secondary Advisors
- 1,100+ Native American Students in the district supported by the program!



Elementary Support

each advisor supports around 230 students on average

- 2 cultural groups each month
- Act as a liaison between staff/school and families as needed
- Attend meetings including, but not limited to: student IEP, disciplinary, MTSS/SST, or any other general concerns that may occur
- Collaborate with building staff and students to create a presence of and safe space for our Native American Students

Elementary Advisors do not monitor grades/attendance/behavior. School staff should contact the advisors if there are concerns and/or when they themselves are struggling to connect with the family.

Secondary Support

each advisor supports around 120-170 students on average

- Monthly Cultural Group
- Monitor grades, attendance, and behavior
- Provide individual and group support to build skill sets for success: time management, self-care, goal setting ,etc.
- Guide & assist with College & Career Preparation
- Attend meetings including, but not limited to: student IEP, disciplinary, MTSS/SST, or any other general concerns that may occur
- Collaborate with building staff and students to create a presence of and safe space for our Native American Students

Family/Community Support

- Bridge between home and school / general advocacy
- Connecting family with school and community resources
- Family Engagement & Student Recognition Events
- Cultural Events & Classes

Additional Program Support

- Cultural Field Trips
- College Visits
- Guest Speakers
- Scholarships for tutoring and ACT prep
- Connecting students/families with summer programming opportunities

Staff/District Support

- Answer questions & advise staff re: Culturally relevant/appropriate curriculum, lessons, and activities
- Provide Professional Develop in building and District Wide
- Collaborate with District Curriculum Teams
- Connect teachers with culturally appropriate resources and information
