Parent Advisory Committee Mission Statement (per 2015-2016 bylaws):

It is the purpose of the Anoka-Hennepin American Indian Parent Advisory Committee (PAC) and Indian Education Program to:

- Encourage and inspire academic achievement, graduation from high school, college readiness, emotional development and cultural awareness of our American Indian students.
- Serve as a resource to review and recommend accurate American Indian history, culture and language curriculum.
- To promote cultural awareness in the community and among staff, parents and students.

Parent Advisory Committee (PAC)

The PAC is composed of parents or guardians of American Indian students, school district representatives, and secondary American Indian students.

Duties:

- Review MN American Indian Education Formula Aid funding, Title VII grant and budget information
- Share input regarding program activities including but not limited to: cultural events, picnics/potlucks, fieldtrips, college visits, etc.
- Share input regarding any other aspects of the program.

Time Commitment: The Indian Education PAC member shall commit to attend one (1) meeting per month (September – June) and special meetings called by the PAC Chairperson as necessary.

Eligibility Requirements for PAC:

- Must be a parent or guardian of an eligible American Indian student(s) grades K-12 or;
- Must be an eligible American Indian student (grades 6-12).
- No more than two members from the same immediate family.
- Any person that has been removed from the PAC is not eligible.

Johnson O' Malley Committee (JOM)

The JOM committee is composed of parents or guardians of JOM-certified American Indian students and works specifically with the JOM Grant.

Duties:

- Review JOM grant and budget information
- Manage and approve JOM grant expenditures
- Review and approve quarterly JOM reports
- Share input regarding program activities including but not limited to: cultural events, picnics/potlucks, fieldtrips, college visits, etc.
- Share input regarding any other aspects of the program.

Time Commitment: The Indian Education JOM member shall commit to attend one (1) meeting per month (September – June) and special meetings called by the PAC Chairperson as necessary.

Eligibility Requirements for JOM:

- Must be a parent or guardian of an eligible JOM student who attends Anoka-Hennepin or;
- A grandparent of an eligible JOM student who attends Anoka-Hennepin and who themselves possess at least one-fourth (1/4) Indian blood or is an enrolled member of a federally recognized tribe.
