THE DIRECTOR

Responsibilities of the Director

- 1. Oversees the play
- 2. Makes sure everyone is doing their job
- 3. Casts the show (decides who is in it)
- 4. Blocks the show (decides all movement)
- 5. Runs rehearsals
- 6. Creates the "vision": Vision is the overall look and feel of the play
- 7. Discovers the plays "theme": Theme is the plays point of view about a subject or it's message

Five Functions of the Director

- 1. Artistic Unification: Make sure that there is a clear Artistic Vision and that everything makes sense together
- 2. Represent the playwright: do the play how you think the play's writer would want it
- 3. Represent the audience: makes sure the audience stays interested and understands the play
- 4. Organizes the work process
- 5. Works with performers

Six Elements of Script Analysis

- 1. Understand the plays theme: the message of the play
- 2. Understand the plays form: is it comedy, serious, mystery....
- 3. Discover Super Objective: What is it that the main person/people wants
- 4. Discover Major Conflict: the main problem; what is preventing the super objective
- 5. Discover Climax: the point of greatest conflict; the deciding moment
- 6. Discover Resolution: how everything wraps up
