This is a Rhythm Composition Assignment. Periodically throughout the year, assignments like this one will give your child a formalized chance to perform for you so you can hear what they are learning in music class. Students needed to use the previously learned elements of rhythm below to write their own song and then perform it for Mr. Weller or another student. This assignment uses rhythms in compound (or 6/8) meter which has a different feel (skipping). This is a review of rhythms learned last year.
