# Anoka Hennepin Independent School District #11 Position Standard

## Technology Specialist (D) – Child Care Specialist Technician

Responsible for Department of Human Services (DHS) licensed daycare center - providing for the care of children participating in the child care education program.

#### **Essential Functions:**

- Maintain appropriate staffing, training, scheduling, and curriculum.
- Assist with payment arrangements, County childcare assistance, and transportation.
- Interface with district, county, and state personnel to maintain compliance with State and County requirements.
- Coordinate the activities of secondary students as they work with nursery school children.

#### **Minimum Qualifications:**

- High School Diploma or equivalent.
- Two years of successful post-high school technical training -- OR -- two years of college in directly applicable courses -- OR -- four years of specialized job-related experience and must include the following:
  - two years of post-secondary training in child development, ability to work with preschool and high school age students, ability to perform position responsibilities.
- Preparation must include specific courses and experience as required by the Department of
  Human Services (DHS)\*\* for day care center directors\* in a day care program. \*Title refers
  to DHS day care terminology and does not imply licensure, certification, or Anoka-Hennepin
  School District employee units. \*\*A copy of alternative education and experience
  requirements is available in the Employee Services Department.
- Good written and verbal communication skills.
- Ability to maintain regular attendance, including completing an assigned day.
- Must be able to lift a minimum of 50 pounds.
- Ability to perform position responsibilities including physical factors, work devices and materials handling, data functions, and people functions.

### **Preferred Qualifications:**

• Previous experience as a child care center supervisor preferred.

#### **Physical Factors include:**

Constant: sitting, twisting/pivot, reaching, repetitive arm, simple grasp, firm grasp, fine

manipulating, talking,

hearing, near vision (up to 20"), midrange vision, far vision (over 20"), visual

accommodation, and field of vision;

Frequent: standing, walking, lifting above shoulder, lifting waist to chest, lifting below

waist, carrying, pushing, pulling, climbing, stooping, kneeling, feeling.

Occasional: exposure to weather when travel between district sites is required.
