Department: Elementary Art Course/Grade Level: Grade 2

Unit Title: Color and Value

Number of Lessons/Days: 10-12 weeks / 1st Trimester

Unit Summary: This unit will be a continuation of what students have learned in 1st grade third trimester, Color. This unit will focus on Color and Value specifically, tints and shades. The students will be given a variety of materials and activities to demonstrate their knowledge of the Elements Color and Value. There will be opportunities for guided practice, peer review, critiquing famous artwork and their own artwork. The cumulative summative assessment (GRASPSS) will be to create color swatches showing Tints and Shades of two of their favorite colors.

- How do you use the element of color in your artwork?
- How do you use the element value in your artwork?

Essential **new** vocabulary:

- Value- how dark and light a color can be.
- **Tint-** mixture of a color using white.
- Shade- mixture of a color using black.
- Color Swatch- examples of a range colors-color samples.
- **Interior Designer-** an artist who decorates the interior of a room or building.
- Stained Glass- colored glass used to form decorative designs
- Pure Color- a color unchanged, no black or white added.

Common misunderstanding(s):

- That value is one color.
- Shades have to be in grey.
