

Medical Anatomy I

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Course Description/Overview

This course focuses on detailed study of normal body structure and functions, disease processes and current health issues and concerns. Since healthcare professionals teach the course, you will have the opportunity to discuss real work situations in anatomy and physiology as it applies to the health field. Medical Anatomy I units include: Introduction and Integumentary System, Musculoskeletal, Digestive, Urinary and Respiratory. Upon successful completion of this course, students may be eligible to receive Tech Prep credit in Medical Anatomy at local college affiliates.

Missing & Late Work

However, the Oakland Consortium does not allow for retakes, therefore the original score will be counted in order to receive college credit.

CAREER AND TECHNICAL COLLEGE CREDIT: CTE

College Credit: students **may** qualify for Tech Prep Credit upon successful completion of Anatomy I & II. An 80% cumulative class average and 80% or higher on the final exam.

CTE Credit requirements must be met for both Anatomy I and Anatomy II for students to receive college credit. Check MNSCU to see if your college will accept the CTE credit.
