This week we...

- o Will start independently walking to the classroom from the AM buses
 - The teachers will begin supporting the students to walk independently to the classroom. Our goal is that within the next couple weeks students will get off the buses "with the big kids" rather than being lead by a teacher.
- o Will be opening "The Costume Shop" in our pretend center
- Are strengthening our fine motor skills (finger muscles) in our sensory table
 by pounding plastic nails into and removing them from pumpkins
- o Are learning how to correctly hold and use scissors

Turn Me Over

- o Go to the school library to check out a book for the first time on Thursday
- o Will practice writing our first names during small group
- Are learning about <u>green</u> (positive, safe, responsible, kind) and <u>red</u> (negative, dangerous, hurtful, disrespectful) choices and how our own behavior affects other people too. Look for more detailed information to come home soon.

Try it at Home:

- Ask your child about the "scissor alligator" ("thumb up, open, shut, this is the way we cut, cut, cut")
 - Let them practice cutting up junk mail or other scraps of paper you no longer need.
- Continue to play "Alphabet Soup" with your child for continued letter practice.
- Point out numbers and patterns you see in your world draw your child's attention to the math concepts/skills that are all around them.
- FACT: Rhymes are fun because it's easy to make them silly! Rhymes teach kids about sounds. They help kids hear when sounds are the same or different.
