Introduction	Attention grabber (hook): Background info (real-life application) Thesis (main idea) statement:
Body Paragraph #1 Subtopic #1	Topic sentence: Supporting Details: 1. 2. 3. Concluding sentence:
Body Paragraph #2 Subtopic #2	Topic sentence: Supporting Details: 1. 2. 3. Concluding sentence:
Body Paragraph #3 Subtopic #3	Topic sentence: Supporting Details: 1. 2. 3. Concluding sentence:
Conclusion	Restate the thesis: How could someone use this information in real life? Make the reader think about what you wrote and want to learn more.

Attention Grabber

- Startling fact or statistic
- Question
- Anecdote
- Quote (perhaps from an expert in the field)
- Brief historical review

Background information

- Should thoroughly explain how the information is important in the real world.
- Who would need this information?
- In what situation is the result of your experiment important?

Thesis

- Should reflect the **main idea** of your background information
- Should explain the real life application (why does anyone care about this information?)

Subtopics

- You may have more than three if you have enough information for a full paragraph on each subtopic
- Possible subtopics:
 - History of your topic
 - Materials used in your experiment
 - Previous research findings
 - Scientific processes that might be involved
 - Related issues that are important to understand
 - Any real life situation that's connected and that requires more than the introduction

Conclusion

- Mention the thesis again but in different words
- Extend the thesis by reviewing why this information is important and who cares
